

## **BPA Safe Harbor from Proposition 65 Labeling DRB OPEP Products**

D.R. Burton Healthcare LLC's iPEP, vPEP (body plus cover), and PocketPEP body does not exceed the limits for BPA (bisphenol A) set in California's Proposition 65 and these devices have safe harbor from Proposition 65 labeling as determined by an independent, third party lab\* and a leading toxicology risk management consultancy\*\*.

The key finding in this independent report\*\*:

*Collectively, the approaches and conservative assumptions included in this report provide additional assurance that the applicable BPA MADL (maximum allowable dose levels) will not be exceeded due to exposure to D.R. Burton Healthcare LLC's iPEP, vPEP (body plus cover), and PocketPEP body. Therefore, these devices have safe harbor from Proposition 65 labeling.*

BPA exposure occurs primarily through dermal contact and also oral contact, so patients using the Oxy-Jet in conjunction with the vPEP are included in the Safe Harbor.
